THREE WAYS TO VIEW LOVE: A. Love is complete – heart, mind, soul and strength. B. Love is consistent – both God and you. C. Love is compelling – if you get it, you gotta give it.	v. 27; Deuteronomy 6:4-6

III. THREE WAYS TO VIEW WHO GOD LOVES:

- A. The thieves viewed the Jew in the ditch as loot, so they **attacked** him; v. 30
- B. The religious folk viewed the man in the ditch as one they did not like, so they avoided him; andv. 31, 32
- C. The Good Samaritan viewed the same man as one he was to love, so he **anointed** him. v. 33, 34
- D. Love is not a group decision.

IV. THREE WAYS TO LOVE WHO LIFE BEATS UP:

v. 30

- A. The man was wounded emotionally;
- B. The man was dying mentally and actually; and
- C. The man was naked socially.
- D. The Good Samaritan did not ask the man how or why he got "jacked up." He simply "loved" him.

V. THREE WAYS TO LOVE LIKE JESUS:

A. The Samaritan, viewed as an enemy of the Jews, **Saves** the man, a Jew; v. 34

B. The Samaritan pays the man's expenses; and v. 35

C. The Samaritan **promises to come back** if needed. v. 35

D. Since the Samaritan "loves" the man, he is called the Good Samaritan.

VI. CONCLUSION

The priest and the Levite, who did not help the man in need, may have gotten beat up by the thieves who were hiding farther down the road. The Good Samaritan, on the other hand, knew where the thieves were hiding, so he took a different route. He knew because the man the Good Samaritan helped told him while he was showing his love.

Moral: When you genuinely show your love for others, God will provide for and protect you! Obeying God's principles has practical implications!
