Introduction

Tonight, we continue exploring the principles of faith and the disciplines of grace essential to living life to the full. These include knowing who we are in Christ and understanding how to access the promises and privileges granted to us as God's children.

Although we have been freed from the law of sin and death (Romans 8:1–2), we remain ineffective as Christians if we don't realize our position—or fail to reckon it so—due to a lack of knowledge about God, His Word, and our identity. God has promised to do exceedingly abundantly above all we could ever ask or think (Ephesians 3:20). Let us, therefore, be prepared to ask—not doubting—but with great expectation!

Our Identity in Christ

The Bible teaches us that if anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). Yet, being born again does not exempt us from spiritual attacks, the lust of the flesh, or the distractions of the world. If we are not grounded in our identity in Christ, we risk falling prey to the enemy. Listed below are a few affirmations that declare our position in Christ:

- You were created in God's image to have dominion. (Genesis 1:26–28)
- You are fearfully and wonderfully made. (Psalm 139:14)
- You are an ambassador for Christ and the righteousness of God. (2 Corinthians 5:20–21)
- You were crucified with Christ; now Christ lives in you. (Galatians 2:20)
- You are a son of God and a joint heir with Christ. (Romans 8:14–17)
- You are complete in Him. (Colossians 2:10); Greater is He that is in you... (1 John 4:4)
- You are seated in heavenly places with Christ. (Ephesians 2:6)
- You are His masterpiece, created for good works. (Ephesians 2:10)
- You are chosen, royal, holy, and special. (1 Peter 2:9)
