Week 3 – Christian Fellowship

Introduction

Webster's Dictionary defines fellowship simply as being in the company of others or participating in shared activities. Yet for the Christian believer, fellowship transcends casual companionship or social engagement. It is spiritual, covenantal, and deeply rooted in our shared life in Christ. This study will explore the biblical concept of fellowship (koinonia), showing how it differs from secular companionship, and how it serves as a vital component of victorious Christian living.

Biblical Definition of Christian Fellowship:

"They continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship..." **Acts 2:42**

Contrasting Christian and Secular Fellowship

Christian Fellowship

- Christ centered and Spirit-led
- Motivated by Love, truth, & spiritual growth
- Strengthens faith and community
- Builds the body of Christ
- Anchored in covenant and accountability

Secular Fellowship

- Common interest or social bonds
- Motivated by pleasure, entertainment, or gain
- Often lacks eternal or spiritual purpose
- Builds social networks or affiliations
- Based on convenience or shared preference
